#### The Art Space in St Nicolas

#### We all need clothes!

We are having a great time making patches for the wall hanging about Earley, several people in St Nicolas are joining in with others around the community. You can see some of the delightful results on <a href="#">#earleyonesquareatatime</a> on Facebook.

It is surprising how many people are talking about the memories held in scraps of beautiful fabric they are using, showing this project has many levels of meaning.

However, do you remember the Bangladeshi Rana Plaza building collapse – now 11 years ago?

A building built with poor foundations, and unsuitable materials later extended a further 4 high stories to become a top-heavy factory housing heavy textile machinery collapsing killing 1,134 people and injury over 2,000 more? Sad, but what has this to do with us? Although slum buildings can be expected to be unstable, this was built to supply the fast fashion industry. The owners forced their employees into the unsafe building to complete orders hours before it collapsed (fine of one month's wages if they didn't). People were shocked, global fast fashion supplies gained an unpleasant reputation. The clothing companies were forced by public opinion to change how they accessed garments. The effects are still with us today but work still needs to be done. The anniversary is 24<sup>th</sup> April

We all need clothes and this week is a good time to assess where we get them and what they are made of, how we dispose of them. Pray for

those who make our clothes, and this week in a bit of spare time repair that tear and replace the missing button, so fast fashion has less of a hold over you!! (also join us and make a patch!)

If you weren't able to join us on the day, you can <u>view the service</u> on our YouTube channel. There is also a gallery of photographs on our Facebook page.


