
News from Oxford Diocese

Delivering a 'solid safeguarding foundation'

In June 2024 the diocese underwent an <u>independent audit</u> of its safeguarding work, undertaken by the INEQE Safeguarding Group. The audit is part of a national programme, commissioned by the Archbishop's Council, to conduct an intensive and comprehensive review of safeguarding at each diocese and cathedral in the Church of England.

The report's authors found the diocese to have 'a solid safeguarding foundation delivered by its exceptionally well-led and blended Safeguarding Team'. The report commended what it described as a 'safeguarding first' philosophy and congratulated our parishes for the sense of optimism it found on the frontline 'where talented Parish Safeguarding Officers (PSOs) lead by example' and 'collaboration is strong'.

A service to celebrate the contribution our PSOs make to the life of the diocese and to lament for those who have experienced abuse in a church context will be held at Christ Church Cathedral on Sunday, 23 November. If you would like to attend, sign up for a <u>ticket online</u>.




What are deprivation levels like in your area?

The 2025 English Indices of Deprivation have been released by the government, ranking every neighbourhood from the most to least deprived. It's important to note that neighbourhood data only gives a general picture, so can hide some of an area's on-the-

ground reality. It also doesn't speak of the strengths and assets of communities, of which are often particularly overlooked in deprived areas. Use the <u>interactive map</u> to find out about deprivation in your parish neighbourhood.

Note: St Nics may not be in an area of deprivation but we have neighbouring areas that are. Indeed parts of Reading are the most deprived in the Diocese.
