



Bishop Steven announces his retirement
Bishop Steven has announced he will retire as the
Bishop of Oxford next July. He plans to lay down
his crozier at a special service at Christ Church
Cathedral on 31 May.

Since the news on Tuesday, Bishop Steven has received many well wishes and messages of

support for his retirement. He would like to take this opportunity to say that all of these messages have been read and very much appreciated. Chairman of the Oxford Diocesan Board of Finance, Sir Hector Sants, reflected on the impact Bishop Steven has made.

He said: "We give thanks to God for Bishop Steven's faithful ministry over the past 10 years.

"He has embodied our vision to become a more Christ-like church and has led with contemplation, compassion and courage.

"Next May we will say goodbye to Bishop Steven with love and appreciation for all he has done, and wish him well in his deserved retirement.

"We are in a good position to begin the process of discernment for Bishop Steven's successor and we would ask for your prayers for this important work."

## Modern science and ancient faith
