The Creed

Holy Father, heavenly King,

because through him you have given us eternal life
And delivered us from the bondage of sin and the fear of death
Into the glorious liberty of the children of God

Therefore with angels and archangels
and all the company of heaven we proclaim your great and glorious name,

Giving of Communion
